## **DEBORAH PULLIAM GRANTS**

## THE UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST CONGREGATION OF CASTINE

These grants are made to perpetuate the memory and promote the values of the late Deborah Pulliam. Ms. Pulliam was a longtime resident and generous benefactor of several institutions in Castine and beyond. As one of the major recipients of her generosity, the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Castine (UUCC) has established a series of annual awards/grants in her name. Preference will be given to organizations that have an impact in our geographic region.

The UUCC is a descendent of the First Congregational Society in Castine, established in 1798. As a member of the Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations (UUA), it promotes "a theologically diverse religion that encourages people to seek their own spiritual path." The Association has adopted seven Principles, three of which are particularly relevant to the legacy of Deborah Pulliam:

Justice, equity, and compassion in human relations.

The goal of a world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all.

Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.

The UUCC, through its Social Justice Committee, invites applications from organizations committed to one or more of the principles, for Deborah Pulliam Grants for the year 2017. Successful applicants will:

- 1. Have provided evidence of their commitment and success in the pursuit of at least one of the Principles of the UUA.
- 2. Submit a budget and a calendar indicating how the grant will be spent.
- 3. Give a description of the geographic area of impact.
- 4. Provide the UUCC with a report at the end of the year indicating the impact from the grant.
